GOLDEN AGER NOTICE

Students who are 60 years of age or older at the time of registration do not pay tuition. This waiver is limited to regular semester credit courses, and applies only if the class has sufficient enrollment and space is available.

All applicable fees are payable and are subject to the refund policy.

STUDENTS WITH ACCOUNT BALANCES FROM PREVIOUS TERMS WILL NOT BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER FOR CLASSES UNTIL THE ACCOUNT IS PAID IN FULL.

During registration, **ALL** tuition and fees must be paid in full. **No student may charge registration expenses to "pending" or "potential" financial aid grants or awards until certified by the ASUMH Financial Aid Office.**

REFUND POLICY

Upon official withdrawal from class, ASUMH will refund tuition according to the following schedule when a Withdrawal Form is completed by the student and processed according to ASUMH policy:

Summer II Session book vouchers may be requested:

July 1 – July 7, 2010 from 8:30 a.m. to 3:30 p.m.

Note: Students MUST bring a copy of their class schedule to receive a book voucher.
NO BOOK VOUCHERS WILL BE ISSUED AFTER JULY 7, 2010 FOR SUMMER II.
LAST DAY TO USE A BOOK VOUCHER FOR SUMMER II WILL BE JULY 8, 2010.

Book vouchers will not be issued to any student whose financial aid file is not complete and ready to pay.

Summer I, Summer II, or Summer I and Summer II financial aid awards:

Students planning to attend BOTH summer sessions will be required to register for BOTH summer sessions by June 1, 2010.



Students **not** registered by this date will **not receive financial aid** funds for both summer sessions.



Students planning to attend both summer sessions, should register for both sessions by June 1, 2010 and be enrolled in six credit hours as required for student loans.



Students planning to attend only the Summer II session must register by June 1, 2010, and be enrolled in six credit hours as required for student loans.



Students not registered by June 1, 2010 will forfeit their financial aid award.

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ADMISSION PROCEDURES

New applicants must submit the following documents for admission and registration:

NOTE: *The following admission requirements must be met before students can register for classes:*

FRESHMAN APPLICANTS:

1. A completed application for admission.
2. Final, official high school transcript showing date of graduation OR GED certificate of completion.
3. Official ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS scores.
4. Provide documentation (required by Arkansas stature) of immunization. Two MMR's are required: measles, rubella, and mumps.
5. All students born or who have lived outside the United States must show documentation of TB screening within the six (6) months prior to enrollment.

TRANSFER APPLICANTS:

1. A completed application for admission.
2. Final, official transcript from **all** colleges attended. Students enrolled at other institutions must submit an official transcript for all work from **each** institution.
3. Provide documentation (required by Arkansas stature) of immunization. Two MMR's are required: measles, rubella, and mumps.
4. All students born or who have lived outside the United States must show documentation of TB screening within the six (6) months prior to enrollment.

Transfer applicants with fewer than 24* credit hours must present ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS scores and high school transcripts.

*If 24 transfer hours do **not** include English or Math, student **MUST** present ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS scores.

COMPASS EXAM

All degree and certificate seeking students must complete the ACT, SAT, ASSET, or COMPASS exam.

ASUMH administers the COMPASS exam.

The cost of the test is \$10.00 payable in the Administrative Affairs Cashier's Office, Roller Hall, 3rd floor, prior to taking the exam.

Length of the test is approximately 2 ½ hours. The test covers:

- Basic Math
- Reading Comprehension
- English (grammar, spelling, and punctuation)
